CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

After coming through the most difficult months for all of us during recent years when the words 'isolation', 'quarantine' and 'shielding' became extremely familiar to us we may be seeing some light at the end of the tunnel – by the way whatever happened to the 'R Factor'.

The world as we knew it changed dramatically in mid March when lockdown was imposed on the whole country and we had to cancel all U3A activities. Your Committee has continued to look for ways to keep you informed and hopefully the monthly Emergency Bulletin has helped to keep you in touch with us.

Two talks for the whole membership from the Mirthy Group were arranged to replace our monthly meetings in June and July both were well received with about 100 members joining for each – dependent on how the situation develops we may try to arrange for another in September as it is considered highly unlikely that a meeting in the normal manner will be possible. At present we are not aware of when the village hall will reopen and what conditions or restrictions will apply. We are also looking at ways to hold our AGM on a virtual basis.

During lockdown some groups have got to grips with technology and used Zoom to hold meetings – these include Transport & Industrial Archaeology, History, Ukulele, Photography, and Crime Fiction whilst Pickleball, Books:Easyreaders, Open Minds, and Creative Writing have either managed or are about to hold garden meetings.

Following on the latest easing of the restrictions some of our cyclists have taken to the roads, our Longer Walking group have traversed part of the Jubilee Trail and the Walking group will shortly be going to Bookham Common all with appropriate social distancing. The Garden Visits group is also restarting. One of our Explore London groups wanted to walk but not travel to London and the idea of a walk at Little London is under consideration! Any information from other groups which have been able to continue in some format would be welcome.

Our new website has now been up and running for about three months and we hope that a good number of you have taken the opportunity to look at it during this time of enforced leisure and any comments/ suggestions for improvement would be appreciated – please send them to me in the first instance davidlush46@hotmail.com or call me on 01483 280267.

Other U3As are doing similar things - we are not alone!



Don't be fooled by the Covid-19 Test and Trace Scams

Criminals are exploiting the COVID-19 pandemic to try and get their hands on your money and personal information. To date, Action Fraud has received reports from 2,378 victims of Coronavirus-related scams, with the total losses reaching over £7 million.

There are some simple steps you can take that will protect you from the most common Coronavirus-related scams. Here's what need to do:

- 1 Watch out for scam messages
 - Your bank, or other official organisations, won't ask you to share personal information over email or text. If you receive an email you're not quite sure about, forward it to the Suspicious Email Reporting Service (SERS): report@phishing.gov.uk
- 2 Shopping online
 - If you're making a purchase from a company or person you don't know and trust, carry out some research first, for example, by checking to see if others have used the site and what their experience was. If you decide to go ahead with the purchase, use a credit card if you have one, other payment providers may not provide the same protection.
- 3 Unsolicited calls and browser pop-ups offering tech support
 Never install any software, or grant remote access to your computer, as a result of a cold
 call. Remember, legitimate organisations would never contact you out of the blue to ask
 for financial details such as your PIN or full banking password.

The NHS Test and Trace service plays an important role in the fight against coronavirus and it's vital the public have confidence and trust in the service. However, we understand the concerns people have about the opportunity for criminals to commit scams.

The NHS Test and Trace service will never:

- * ask you to dial a premium rate number to speak to them (e.g. those starting 09 or 087)
- * ask you to make any form of payment or purchase a product or any kind
- * ask for any details about your bank account
- * ask for your social media identities or login details, or those of your contacts
- * ask you for any passwords or PINs, or ask you to set up any passwords or PINs over the phone
- * ask you to download any software to your PC or ask you to hand over control of your PC, smartphone or tablet to anyone else
- * ask you to access any website that does not belong to the government or NHS
